

The Turner Journal

Compiled and Transcribed by John P. DuLong and
Patricia A. (McGuinness) DuLong

This journal of family events was made by Eleanor “Ellen” (Thompson) Turner (fl. 1805-1884). It would appear that she transcribed these data from an earlier diary or journal. She added clarification to some events that she could not have known about at the time of the event. For example, in 1827 she records the marriage of James Palmer to Eliza Nash and mentions that she had three children, but at least two of them were born after the marriage. In addition, changes in handwriting indicates that others added to the journal.

Ellen was the daughter of Thomas Thompson and Anne Ribton. Her mother was the daughter of Allan Ribton and Hannah de Renzi and her aunt was Caroline Ellen Ribton the wife of Dr. John Hoskyns. Her great-aunt was Ellen de Renzi the wife of Major James Palmer.¹ Ellen Thompson married Henry Turner.

Ellen was well educated and appeared to enjoyed traveling. She made trips through England, Scotland, Ireland, and Wales. Most of the events recorded in this journal relate to family and friends in the areas of Dublin, Ireland, and Caernarvon, Wales. The period covered is from 1786 to 1892.

The provenance of this journal is that it was passed from Ellen to her son Charles John Ribton-Turner, then to her grandson Vernon Ribton-Turner, to her great-granddaughter Elizabeth Ribton-Turner of Farnham, Surrey, England. Elizabeth’s brother John Humphrey Ribton-Turner did some research on the family and used the journal. His daughter, Ann Ribton-Turner, married David John Stiven Barrie and he did a transcription of the journal that he shared with Charles William Ryall of Australia. In 2001, Charles shared the transcription of the journal with us along with a photocopy of the journal². With his help we contacted Ann (Turner) Barrie who in turn introduced us to Elizabeth Ribton-Turner who in 2003 very kindly shared with us a photocopy of the original journal and gave us permission to publish it.³ For this transcription we relied on the photocopy of the journal from Elizabeth because it was a clearer copy, but found that she had neglected to copy several pages that Charles’s copy included and which we added in chronological order.

Our main interest in the journal is the handful of Palmer and Hoskyns mentions. Although much of this journal does not involve these families, we felt it was such a unique find, crammed with interesting genealogical facts, some of which were lost with the destruction of the Irish Civil War, that we were justified in transcribing the entire journal here for the benefit of other researchers. Besides the Palmer and Hoskyns families, the other families of interest for our research found in this journal include the De Renzy, Ribton, Thompson, and Turner families. We have found some of these same families appearing in the letters and documents we consulted involving the Palmers and Hoskyns.

For a certain class of people during the Victorian period the British Empire was a small world for them with friends and relatives spread from Canada to South Africa to India and to Australia. This was the case with Ellen and her social world. Her journal mentions many places in the far-flung British Empire, mostly in India.

Without a doubt many more people mentioned in this journal could be identified further with some research. We have focused on those entries relating to the Palmers and Hoskyns of Ireland and really do not know many of the Welsh and English families mentioned in the journal. If you know something of substance regarding these people, then please let us know. There are enough clues in this journal to keep a team of Irish and Welsh genealogist busy for months identifying people.

Although we have not tried to identify all the people mentioned in the journal, we did try to identify the places in footnotes. However, some places are marked by [?] as we could not determine where they were located.
